FOOD FOR LIFE UPDATE



The Co-ordinators are working on the schedule for next year – from June 5th to May 28th, 2018. IF ANY ONE is interested in volunteering for this very worthwhile program please contact either Ann David or Beryl Gorrie. On the other hand, if anyone is currently on our list of volunteers and feel that they would like to be removed from the rotation of volunteers, the contact would be the same. If you are not familiar with this program, - On Mondays (except on holiday Mondays), “Food for Life” delivers foods donated by local grocerias to our church to be available for those less fortunate than ourselves. There are two co-ordinators each Monday as well as 2 and sometimes 3 volunteers to assist. The set-up time is from approximately 10:30 – 12:00, at which time the clients, by drawing a number, go through the line of foods and make their choices. The actual shopping time is from 12:00 – 1:00 and clean up time is usually 5 to 10 minutes. So, your turn in the rotation would be probably once every nine or ten weeks.

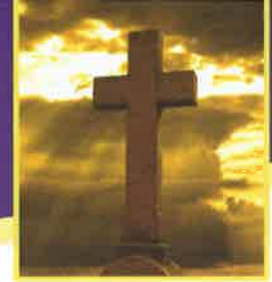
