



# September 2018 Report from the BEPC Session

*~ Session's communication, to the congregation, of major items discussed and major decisions made at each Session meeting. ~*

- Session continues to meet on the first Monday of each month, except for July and August.
- Burlington East held its third Vacation Bible School, with the support of *Kintail on the Road*, from Tuesday, August 7 through Friday, August 10. The theme this year was “The Water of Life”. Seventeen kids attended. We want to thank all the volunteers who helped make the week fun and enjoyable for them.
- Session continues to work on finalizing a BEPC Go Forward Plan. This plan would outline our priorities and objectives for the next several years. A draft plan was reviewed at the June Session meeting and a half-day special meeting will be held on Saturday, November 10. At this meeting, we hope to get the plan to the point where we could present it to the congregation.
- You may have noticed that, near the piano in the Douglas Hall, there is a crack in the wall. Water was seeping in through the crack when it rained. At the June Session meeting, a motion was approved to have RCC Waterproofing repair this crack. The cost was approximately \$1,800 and the money will be taken from the Heritage Fund. Work was completed in August.
- In April, the BEPC W.M.S. group determined that there was not enough interest to continue holding W.M.S. meetings and, therefore, made the decision to stop meeting. Their decision was supported by Session. The Hamilton Presbyterial Women’s Missionary Society was advised and they acknowledged that our decision mirrored that of many churches. We thank those who were involved with the BEPC W.M.S. over the years for their hard work and dedication.
- Session asks that everyone review the financial update which is in the September 23 bulletin. As noted in the update, we are running with a significant year-to-date deficit and, as such, all need to ensure our givings are up-to-date. If you are on PAR, you may want to consider an additional contribution or increasing your monthly amount.

- Earlier in the year, Session initiated a project entitled “Jethro” which is intended to better spread the workload among Session and congregational members. First outcomes of this are to identify a Deputy Clerk and the formation of a Worship Committee. We hope to have these items in place prior to the end of 2018. NOTE: if you want to know where the project name came from, look up Exodus 18.
- Each committee and/or group of Session has been asked to provide Session with a Roles and Responsibilities document. Once all of these have been received, Session will review them to ensure that no overlaps or gaps exist. In addition, we are also completing Roles and Responsibilities documents for various jobs (i.e. Financial Usher, Greeter, Duty Elder, etc).
