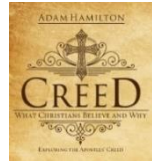

Bible Study on the Apostle's Creed

What Christians Believe and Why

During this study you will have the opportunity to explore what it is we believe using the vehicle of the Apostle's Creed, one of the most widely used and best-known confessional statements of the Western Church. The study is based on Adam Hamilton's book *Creed: What Christians Believe and Why*, a study guide, and a DVD in which Hamilton explores the Creed in a group setting. I believe that this study will be an enlightening way to enter Advent, which begins as this study ends.

All of us have heard friends and neighbours say "...I'm staying in my home until I'm carried out...". Hopefully that will be the future for all of us however sudden and unplanned events happen which result in us having to find alternative living arrangements. Health issues top the list of events, but other issues include our inability to do all the things necessary to maintain our home. The death of a spouse and the concern of our adult children about our welfare all may play a part in our having to seek a different living arrangement.

To assist the congregation in learning about the alternatives available in living arrangements, the **Pastoral Care Committee** has arranged for a representative of the Ontario Retirement Community Association (ORCA) to speak to us on the various living options available in the community. Some of the questions that will be answered are:

- What are the different types of facilities available?
- What is the difference in each type?
- What does each type of facility offer in services?
- How does a client decide which facility is best suited to them?
- Does anyone other than the client decide what facility is suitable for them?
- What is the price range for each type of facility?
- What is the average price range for each type of facility in the Burlington area?
- Are the government programs that could assist senior through subsidization?
- Are such programs "means tested"?
