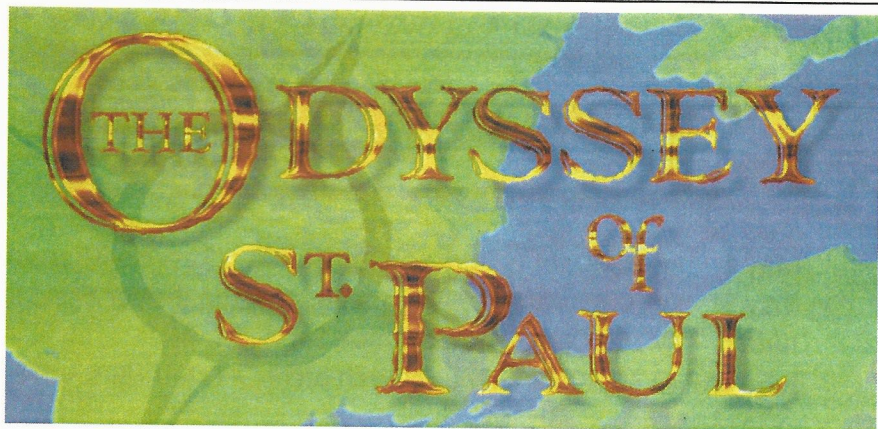


GUEST SPEAKER: Lorna Dueck

BIBLE STUDY – “The Odyssey of St Paul”

Wednesdays at 7:30 pm starting April 27th and repeated on

Thursdays at 11 am starting April 28th

NOTE: This Bible study is planned to run for eight weeks, please don't worry about committing for 8 weeks. Please come to all 8 weeks, but you won't fall behind if you miss a week here or there because of appointments or other commitments.

We will be looking at a DVD for about 25 minutes and then studying various selected readings from Paul's writings in the New Testament. We hope to build a good picture of the man Paul and importantly, of what God has said and is saying today through his writings.

From the study guide:

Aside from Jesus himself, no one has had a greater influence on the founding of Christianity than Paul of Tarsus. Among his many achievements, three are of prime importance:

- 1) as a powerful, tireless missionary, he spread the faith to Asia Minor, Greece, and Italy;
- 2) his letters, which form much of the New Testament, present a basic theology for Christianity; and
- 3) more than anyone else, he brought Gentiles into the early church, not only Jews, thus “universalizing” the faith.

Although we have the Gospel records but no writings from the pen of Jesus himself, in Paul's case we have both, in the sense that the second part of the Book of Acts serves as Luke's “gospel” about this greatest apostle. In addition to Paul's letters and the record in Acts, this series will also use geographical, archaeological, and secular literary evidence to provide a fully dimensional portrait of St. Paul, the man and his mission.

LIST OF ITEMS NEEDED

- People to sew pouches for eyeglasses (fleece & quilted material is all cut and provided to you, as well as instructions) (each pouch takes about 10 minutes)
- Knitted newborn hats and mitts for neonatal unit at a hospital
- Knitted izzy dolls (5" tall) (pattern is on the internet)
- Knitted cotton dishcloths (about 8" square) (pattern is on the internet)
- Balls of chunky wool (gauge: 8 sts and 14 rows = 4" (10 cm) in garter st.
- Knitting needles, Size U.S. 13 (9 mm)
- Flannelette receiving blankets
- Pencils, Coloured pencils, Markers (preferably washable), Erasers, Rulers
(No crayons thanks, they melt)
- Stickers
- Coloured pipe cleaners
- Cash donations (US dollars preferred) You can also donate through our special giving envelopes on the bulletin board.
 - to purchase supplies for us to make porridge (many people survive on only 1 meal a day),
 - paper (too heavy to take with us so we will buy it in Malawi),
 - first aid and medical supplies (band aids, bandages, alcohol wipes, Tylenol, etc.)
- A large retired hockey bag, preferably with wheels, to be used as a piece of luggage and for carrying donated items in. It will be donated to the people of Malawi.
