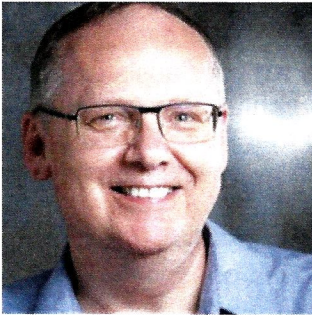

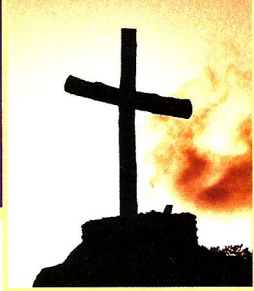

Christ is Risen!

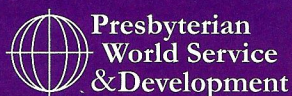
