

# JUNE, 2024 – NEWSLETTER



As we head into the summer of 2024, seldom has the world had more need of the Christian qualities of faith, trust and hope coupled with charity and compassion .

One of the elders at BEPC suggested this as the starting place for our newsletter this month, and this summer. It's wise, and challenging, and hits the mark.

We are heading into a time which we typically think of as 'down' time—time to relax, refresh, enjoy time outside. Spiritual, physical and emotional care are all important parts of our lives as Christians—both for ourselves, others and the world God made. On the seventh day of creation (which became the Sabbath in the Jewish tradition), God called a halt, a rest. That rest was for a purpose. It wasn't permanent. It was for refreshing so that creation could resume the cycles and growth that God had put in place.

As we look at summer, and at the quote above, we can take time to refresh our view and our priorities for how we witness to Jesus here and now. The quote specifically names the qualities as Christian—what makes them that way?

At BEPC, our mission and vision are "To know Christ and make Him known" and to 'Live every day for Jesus'. When we look at the qualities of faith, trust, hope, charity and compassion, we can see that when Christ is at the centre of our choice to embody these qualities, we also choose to engage in the sacrifice, awareness, openheartedness, and hope in the gospel that will make these qualities part of a witness to who and what the church is in the world rather than just trying to 'be good'.

We are not just called to be good. We are called to be like Christ. As we've learned in the study on James, our faith in Christ and actions that witness to God's love complete each other.

And to do that successfully, we need to know who Christ is and where we are called to be.

This summer, as we try as a community to live our faith, trust, hope, charity and compassion, I'd invite you to journey in faith as we do three things:

- 1. Get to know Christ better through reading the gospel of Luke. We'll be journeying through Luke and Acts later in the fall and winter of this year. Let's make this the community summer reading project!
- 2. Listen and look as we go from day to day, from news article to conversations with friends. Where is God calling you to be Christ's presence and to tell Christ's story?
- 3. Pray that God will show us where to work to fill needs of the community with faith, trust, hope, charity and compassion, and that we will have the courage to act on the visions God gives (as you read through these pages, you'll see some initiatives have already started!).

Here is another quote that may help us think and act on that. Fredrick Buechner said that "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." (Frederick Buechner, Wishful Thinking: A Seeker's ABC.)

Where are those places for you?

Looking forward to journeying with you.

## BEPC Session met May 6, moderated by Rev. Susan Kerr

A letter from the city has been pinned on the bulletin board for members to read about a proposed multi-tenant housing proposal on three lots on the other side of Walkers Line.

Session continued discussions on a proposed new pastoral care model based on the results of an April workshop. The current model remains in effect until the Fall.

Rev. Kerr plans to lead a BEPC visioning team starting in the fall of 2024.

Rev. Kerr reported enthusiastically on the youth group, whose members have been helping with activities in the church and with visiting, and are bringing skills and enthusiasm to BEPC's Summer Camp.

Flyers have gone to nearby churches about Summer Camp. Rev. Kerr plans orientation/leading with care briefings. Margot Polk and Ann David have volunteered to do follow up personal calls to all families that attend.

Rev. Kerr thanked parents and grandparents who are bringing children to Sunday School.

For the Congregational Care Committee, Stephen Shields also noted with satisfaction the growth in the number of children attending church school, the increased membership of the youth group and additional newcomers to BEPC.

Rev. Kerr noted that there will be classes for new members on Sunday, May 19 and Sunday, June 23. The first Sunday will be a welcome and orientation to the PCC and what we believe. On June 23 there will be a meet-and-greet with Session followed by a celebration at the church picnic.

Session agreed on a greeting table for new members and visitors (see below). Ron Dekker and Margaret Whitwell will lead this initiative.

Ron Dekker reported for the finance and maintenance committee that BEPC's deficit continues to grow, but at a slower rate, thanks to a positive response following the financial update provided to the congregation on April 28. *The Finance & Maintenance team is appreciative of all who have increased their givings.*



## **Hostage**

**1 John 5:19** - We know that we are children of God and that the world around us is under the control of the evil one. (NLT)

When people say that they are hostage to something, it means that they are being involuntarily controlled by some outside influence. Sometimes, I feel like I'm being held hostage by forces over which I have no control.

The recreational vehicle park in which I live was bought by a large corporation in 2021. Since then, we've had five managers, three activity directors, constant upheaval with remodelling, and conflict between administration and residents, as this company tries to figure out how to do business in a situation for which they have no previous experience. What used to be a pleasant place to live is not anymore, and there is nothing that I can do about it, except move. I like my house, and my family lives here, so I remain.

On top of all this, inflation is rampant. Gas prices are constantly rising without warning or apparent cause. A bag of groceries is now triple the price of a year or two ago. But I still need gas and groceries, so I, like the rest of the world, pay, despite my worry about finances.

Government leaders pass laws that are completely contrary to biblical principles or that waste millions of dollars on programs and purposes that benefit only their own selfish ambitions. Christians in government positions are constantly stymied in their efforts to make the right decisions. I pray for our leaders, but otherwise, I am held hostage by their actions.

**2 Corinthians 4:4a** - Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. (NLT)

We shouldn't be surprised at any of this, as throughout history, mankind has rejected God and been deceived by Satan. It started in the Garden of Eden and continues unabated. Satan actively participates in blinding the eyes of those who don't believe in Jesus and thus have no desire to come to Him or do what is right in His eyes. But there is hope!

1 John 5:4-5 - For every child of God defeats this evil world, and we achieve this victory through our faith. And who can win this battle against the world? Only those who believe that Jesus is the Son of God. (NLT)

This verse tells us that we can win this battle by putting our faith in Him, trusting our lives to Him, and letting the Holy Spirit lead us. We may not see resolution in our time, but we will have the ultimate victory when we reign with Jesus in heaven. He said:

**John 16:33** - I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world. (NLT)

Because Jesus is victorious, so will we be! Hallelujah!

**Prayer:** Thank You, Lord, that You are in control. Help us to look to You as we deal with life's difficulties. Amen

Our senior years can be viewed as a pleasantly useless era ... Or we can see them as a time of great opportunity to be used for God.

We can serve as mentors, teaching wisdom and virtue. (Psalm 71:18; Jeremiah 6:16).

There is power in the example of an ordinary life lived with an awareness of God's presence - seeing him in everything and doing all things for him. This is the mark of the mature soul - quietly and humbly going about ordinary tasks, living in joy, and leaving behind the fragrance of Jesus' love.

Even if our journey leads to illness and weakness ... we can still pray. Prayer is one of the special privileges of infirmity, and in the end may be its greatest benefit.

Above all, we can love. Love remains our last and best gift to God and to others.

Mentoring, being a godly example, praying and loving. These are the opportunities of growing old with God.

When I am old and grayheaded, O God, do not forsake me, until I declare Your strength to this generation. Psalm 71:18
